HOW TO RECYCLE: Single Stream Recyclables, no sorting necessary, consisting of recyclable glass, aluminum, cans, plastic and papers. Place at curb in containers (no garbage bags). Remove all caps and lids, recycle loose metal lids, Bottles, cans & boxes must be empty and free of food residue.

Recycling containers must have handles and lids. There is a 50 pound weight limit. A 32 gallon container is recommended. If necessary use multiple containers.

WHAT TO RECYCLE

Aluminum food & beverage containers, clean aluminum foil, pie plates & trays
Glass food & beverage containers
Steel (tin) cans
Plastic bottles & non-bottles codes **PET #1, HDPE #2, LDPE#4, PP #5, and Other #7**
Paper juice, broth, milk cartons, frozen food boxes
Newspaper
Corrugated cardboard
Magazines
Catalogs
Cereal boxes, tissue boxes, paper towel cores
Paper bags
Telephone books
Printer & copier paper
Mail
Office paper without wax liners
Paperback books
Shredded paper **must be in clear or translucent plastic bag**

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Textiles
Deposit in bin at Recycling Depot
Styrofoam containers (including egg cartons and packing "peanuts")
Place in trash (some shippers accept packing peanuts)
Plastic Bags
Some grocery stores have bins for recycling plastic bags
Metal Pots & Pans
Place in trash
Mirrors, auto glass, light bulbs, glass cookware/bake ware, ceramics, porcelain
Place in trash
Alkaline batteries (not hazardous)
Place in trash
Hard cover books (readable condition)
