REPORTS:

- Nursing Report Public Health Nurse Bridget Colendenski read the nursing report.
 Test kits have been redistributed; some of the test had been expiring, but they will be receiving a new batch.
- 2) R.E.H.S. Report *Beau Preston* read the list of completed inspections, including several reported food-borne illnesses at Chatham restaurants, as well as a reinspection that was completed on a local chicken restaurant. The staff had issues with hot holding, sauce temperatures, and handwashing. They were rated conditional and were found to be compliant upon reinspection.
- 3) Animal Control Report: The Board reviewed the "year in review" report provided by Animal Control Solutions.
- 4) Health Officer Monthly Update: Megan Avallone provided her update:

- a) Norovirus transmission is high.
- b) There is another uptick in covid; 75% of cases are the XBB 1.5 variant strain. The bivalent vaccine is considered highly effective.
- c) Megan offered to host a booster clinic for ages 65+
- d) There has been a marked increase in hospitalizations, ventilator use, and unfortunately deaths.
- e) It is difficult to detect what strains, but historically 3-5% are subtyped.
- f) Those in the community who died in December were not boosted with the most recent bivalent booster.
- g) Children in Chatham have low vaccination rates: 4 and under (pee wee) just came out six months ago. Only 15% of Borough children 6months 2years have been vaccinated & boosted; for 3-4year olds only 43% have completed their full series.
- h) It is possible most children did have covid and are waiting the 90-day period for their boosters.

- Review of 2022 Goals & Objectives
- Licensing: reasonable time allowed for license renewal.
 - a) There are 180 licenses processed as of today.
- Increased late fees passed by council.
 - a) There was a fee increase by the Mayor & Council for unlicensed dogs to \$50.
 - b) There are many people unaware of the importance of licensing their pet.
 - c) Dog canvassing is discussed again.
- Wellness van in June
 - a) Megan said the question is the company may not still be doing the van, she will check.
