RESOLUTION APPOINTING FUND COMMISSIONER TO THE MORRIS COUNTY JOINT INSURANCE FUND

WHEREAS, Public Law 1983, c.372 (N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et seq.) permits municipalities to join together to form a joint insurance fund; and

WHEREAS, the Morris County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund is duly constituted as a Municipal Self-Insurance Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham is a member of the Morris County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et seq., as well as, the Bylaws of the Morris County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund provide that "in the manner generally prescribed by law, each member shall appoint one (1) commissioner to the Fund; and

WHEREAS, each member shall select either a member of its governing body or one of its employees; and

WHEREAS the term of the appointment is either:

- 1. A commissioner, other than the special commissioner, who is a member of the appointing municipality's governing body shall hold office for two (2) years or for the remainder of his/her term of office as a member of the governing body, whichever shall be less; or.
- 2. Commissioners who are employees of the appointing municipality shall hold office at the pleasure of the utility authority and can be removed by the municipality at any time without cause.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham does hereby appoint the Borough's Chief Finance Officer, Timothy Day, to serve as Fund Commissioner to the Morris County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Borough officials are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer recommends that the award of the contract be made to JML Landscaping, Inc., in the amount of \$22,162.00; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance has confirmed that sufficient funds are available in Capital Improvement Fund Account # C-04-55-911-501 for the award of this contract.

RESOLUTION #14-329

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE INTERLOCAL SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE SERVICES WITH THE BOROUGH OF MADISON

WHEREAS, Resolution #13-381 adopted by the Borough Council on November 25, 2013 authorized the Borough to enter into an Interlocal Service Agreement with the Borough of Madison for all state mandated Uniform Construction Code Services pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Borough entered into an Interlocal Service Agreement with the Borough of Madison on November 26, 2013, which provided, among other things, a three (3) year term beginning January 1, 2014 and terminating on December 31, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Interlocal Service Agreement to establish a four (4) year term in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.6(b)3; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to stipulate to certain matters as set forth in N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.6 through 4.8 providing (i) the term of office of any construction official shall be for four (4) years; (ii) only one central office shall be required, however, the parties may establish offices which are reasonably accessible in terms of distance, location and function, and (iii) the Borough of Madison, as provider, shall administer and enforce the Uniform Construction Code.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that they hereby amend the Interlocal Service Agreement as set forth herein; and

RESOLUTION PERMITTING PILGRIM PIPELINE HOLDINGS, LLC ACCESS TO CERTAIN BOROUGH PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREPARING A PIPELINE SURVEY

WHEREAS, Pilgrim Pipeline Holdings, LLC is proposing to develop an East Coast pipeline to carry crude oil from Albany, New York to refineries in Linden, New Jersey, and to carry refined petroleum products northbound from New York Harbor to Upstate New York; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council asked the Borough Administrator to notify Pilgrim Pipeline Holdings, LLC that access to Borough property for surveying purposes only is authorized.
