#### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### Budget and Finance

James Lonergan reported he has asked the Board of Education to prepare a 10 year capital budget plan. He reported the School District of the Chathams is ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> best public school in the state.

Ms. Fife stated the School District of the Chathams is ranked 209<sup>th</sup> in the county by US News and World Report.

#### **Public Works Planning**

John Holman reported DPW has opened part of Shepard Kollock Park; the main soccer field is open and one of the diamonds is open. Pot holes have been filed.

#### Board of Health

John Holman reported the Madison Board of Health is holding two clinics. The one on May 7<sup>th</sup> is a free oral health check up and on May12th a women's cancer screening. Appointments for both clinics must be made call 973-593-3079 ext. 1.

#### Personnel

Victoria Fife stated the committee is interviewing for the clerk's position.

#### Public Safety & Emergency Services

James J. Collander reported all the fire hydrants will be marked with fire hydrant markers. The 176 critical hydrants will be marked first. Mr. Lott is reviewing the Borough's solicitation ordinance. Chief Crosson is working on a ride along program for the Police Department.

### Shared Services & 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Agreements

Gerald Helfrich reported the shared services agreement with the Madison Construction Office seems to be working well.

Mr. Holman stated the Joint Court is working on the backlog from Morris Township.

#### Long Range Traffic & Pedestrian Safety Planning

James J. Collander had nothing new to report.

#### Madison/Chatham Joint Meeting

John Holman stated the capital projects are going well. If a bond needs to be issued they will have a AAA rating.

#### MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bruce A. Harris was not present. Council President Fife reminded everyone that Spring Clean will be held on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Robert J. Falzarano reported on a pipe line that is being proposed by Pilgrim Pipeline. It would be in the right of way that PSE&G has in Chatham. They anticipate that it will not be ready until 2017. Rotary Park has been cleared; the wall will be installed shortly. The Park should be

completed by June 1<sup>st</sup>. Mr. Lott is working with the DOT to get permission to install two crosswalks at Colman Avenue and Main Street.
