RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, COVENANTING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, APPLICABLE TO THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES OF INTEREST ON OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, BOROUGH CLERK, INTERIM CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS THEY MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFECT SUCH COMPLIANCE AND DESIGNATING A \$2,385,000 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE, DATED MAY 22, 2020, PAYABLE MAY 21, 2021, AS A "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION" PURSUANT TO SECTION 265(b)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham, in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Borough") from time to time issues bonds, notes and other obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, and desires to take such action as may be necessary or advisable to establish and maintain such exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), contains provisions with respect to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations, including provisions, among others, which require issuers of tax-exempt obligations, such as the Borough to account for and rebate certain arbitrage earnings to the United States Treasury and to take other action to establish and maintain such Federal tax exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to issue a \$2,385,000 bond anticipation note, dated May 22, 2020, payable May 21, 2021 (the "Note"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to designate the Note as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham, in the County of Morris, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council hereby covenants on behalf of the Borough, to the extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Jersey, to do and perform Page 3 of 8

all acts and things permitted by law and necessary to assure that interest paid on the Note be and remain excluded from gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Code.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. The Mayor, Borough Clerk, Interim Chief Financial Officer and the other officials of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take such action, make such representations and give such assurances as they may deem necessary or advisable to effect compliance with the Code.

SECTION 3. The Note is hereby designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Note is not a "private activity bond" as defined in the Code and (2) the Borough and its subordinate entities, if any, do not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) during calendar year 2020.

SECTION 5. It is further determined and stated that the Borough has not, as of the date hereof, issued any tax-exempt obligations (other than the Note) during calendar year 2020.

SECTION 6. The Borough will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with respect to the limitations on the issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code; however, said Borough does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a covenant is not made hereby.

SECTION 7. The issuing officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Note and to further provide such original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2020 dated as of the date of delivery of the Note.

SECTION 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM, COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, APPOINTING DAVID HOLLBERG OF PHOENIX CONSULTING GROUP AS CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER FOR THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:9-140.10 requires that "in every municipality there shall be a chief financial officer appointed by the governing body of the municipality"; and

WHEREAS, when a vacancy occurs in the office of chief financial officer following the appointment of a certified municipal finance officer to that office, N.J.S.A. 40A:9-140.10 and N.J.A.C. 5:32-2.5 permits a municipality the option to seek approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services (DGLS) in the Department of Community Affairs to appoint a private entity to temporarily perform the duties of a chief financial officer for no more than two consecutive one-year terms; and

WHEREAS, following the resignation of Timothy Day, CMFO, there existed a vacancy in the office of Chief Financial Officer for the Borough as of July 2, 2019; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution #19-239, adopted on July 8, 2019, the Borough previously appointed Stephen Williams to serve as Temporary Chief Financial Officer for a period of not more than twelve months; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution #19-277, adopted on October 29, 2019, the Borough entered into a professional services contract with Phoenix Consulting Group for financial consultant services for the remainder of 2019 retroactive to June 26, 2019; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution #20-03, adopted on January 6, 2020, the Borough entered into a professional services contract with Phoenix Consulting Group for financial consultant services for calendar year 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to appoint David Hollberg, CMFO, of Phoenix Consulting Group, as the Chief Financial Officer for the Borough retroactive to January 1, 2020 and to ratify any and all prior acts taken by Mr. Hollberg as the Borough's financial consultant acting as Temporary Chief Financial Officer for the Borough as of that date; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hollberg's appointment, and the Borough's contract with Phoenix Consulting Group, shall be subject to the approval of the Director of the DLGS; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council further desires to rescind Administrator Williams' appointment as Temporary Chief Financial Officer for the Borough as of January 1, 2020; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham, in the County of Morris and the State of New Jersey, that the Borough hereby appoints David Hollberg, CMFO, of Phoenix Consulting Group as the Chief Financial Officer for the Borough retroactive to January 1, 2020 and to ratify any and all prior acts taken by Mr. Hollberg as the Borough's financial consultant acting as Temporary Chief Financial Officer for the Borough as of that date, subject to the terms and conditions of this Resolution. The Borough further rescinds Administrator Williams' appointment as Temporary Chief Financial Officer for the Borough as of January 1, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Borough officials and employees are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.
