RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT FOR ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month originated in 1978 when New York Congressman Frank Horton introduced a bill that called for the first week each May to be so designated with President Jimmy Carter issuing the first presidential proclamation for Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week in March 1979. AAPI Heritage Week was expanded to a commemorative month in 1990 in a bill signed into law by President George H.W. Bush, which had to be reauthorized each year the commemoration received permanent designation each May, in a law enacted in 1992; and WHEREAS, Congressman Horton was inspired by former Capitol Hill staffer Jeanie Jew, who approached him about the idea in 1976. Jeannie Jew observed that just as Black History Month was decreed by President Ford in 1976, and Hispanic Heritage Week was decreed by President Johnson in 1968, there was a need to provide similar recognition to Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders; and

WHEREAS, Jeanie Jew's great-grandfather, M.Y. Lee, had immigrated to the United States from China in the 1800s and had helped build the Transcontinental Railroad. As noted by Congressman Horton, M.Y. Lee became a prominent California businessman who was later killed in Oregon during a period of anti-Chinese and anti-Asian sentiment in that state; and

WHEREAS, the month of May was selected for two reasons: (1) to commemorate the arrival of the first known Japanese immigrant to the U.S. on May 7, 1843, and (2) to honor the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad on May 19, 1869, which upwards of 20,000 Chinese workers helped to construct; and

WHEREAS, as an insidious consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the AAPI community in the United States is experiencing an alarming rise in anti-AAPI hate crimes and bias incidents, largely being unfairly blamed for the Coronavirus pandemic and echoing the anti-Asian sentiments that were prevalent in the 1800's and that led to the enactment of the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, which prohibited Chinese immigration to the United States, and which was not repealed until 1943; and

WHEREAS, in our continued efforts to live up to the American values of freedom, justice and equality for all people, the events of this past year have made evident two principles: first, that institutional and structural racism continues to have insidious consequences on the peace, health and safety of our larger community and nation, and must be dismantled; and second, that it is incumbent upon each of us as individuals to challenge our own biases or assumptions regarding race and become better educated.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham proudly joins in recognizing the annual celebration of Asian American and Pacific Islander History Month and continuing our collective journey, as a community and nation, in honoring and deepening our knowledge of the history and contributions of AAPI members to the American economy, society, culture, freedoms, and values.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT FOR ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month originated in 1978 when New York Congressman Frank Horton introduced a bill that called for the first week each May to be so designated with President Jimmy Carter issuing the first presidential proclamation for Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week in March 1979. AAPI Heritage Week was expanded to a commemorative month in 1990 in a bill signed into law by President George H.W. Bush, which had to be reauthorized each year the commemoration received permanent designation each May, in a law enacted in 1992; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Horton was inspired by former Capitol Hill staffer Jeanie Jew, who approached him about the idea in 1976. Jeannie Jew observed that just as Black History Month was decreed by President Ford in 1976, and Hispanic Heritage Week was decreed by President Johnson in 1968, there was a need to provide similar recognition to Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders; and

WHEREAS, Jeanie Jew's great-grandfather, M.Y. Lee, had immigrated to the United States from China in the 1800's and had helped build the Transcontinental Railroad. As noted by Congressman Horton, M.Y. Lee became a prominent California businessman who was later killed in Oregon during a period of anti-Chinese and anti-Asian sentiment in that state; and

WHEREAS, the month of May was selected for two reasons: (1) to commemorate the arrival of the first known Japanese immigrant to the U.S. on May 7, 1843, and (2) to honor the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad on May 19, 1869, which upwards of 20,000 Chinese workers helped to construct; and ¹

WHEREAS, as an insidious consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the AAPI community in the United States is experiencing an alarming rise in anti-AAPI hate crimes and bias incidents, largely being unfairly blamed for the Coronavirus pandemic and echoing the anti-Asian sentiments that were prevalent in the 1800s and that led to the enactment of the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, which prohibited Chinese immigration to the United States, and which was not repealed until 1943; and

WHEREAS, in our continued efforts to live up to the American values of freedom, justice and equality for all people, the events of this past year have made evident two principles: first, that institutional and structural racism continues to have insidious consequences on the peace, health and safety of our larger community and nation, and must be dismantled; and second, that it is

ORDINANCE # 21-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 195 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM, "PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND RECREATION AREAS," TO CLARIFY THAT SMOKING OF ANY SUBSTANCE IN SUCH AREAS IS PROHIBITED

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:48-2, the governing body of a municipality may make, amend, repeal, and enforce such other ordinances, regulations, rules and by-laws not contrary to the laws of this state or of the United States, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good of government, order and protection of person and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants, and as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed by this subtitle, or by any law; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40:61-1, the Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham ("Council") is further authorized to adopt ordinances for the government, use and policing of all public parks under its jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing statutory authority, the Council has promulgated rules for the use and enjoyment of Borough parks, which are codified at Chapter 195 of the Code of the Borough of Chatham ("Code"); and,

WHEREAS, given recent changes in the law, including the legalization of recreational marijuana, the Council wishes to clarify its "no-smoking" regulations as set forth in the Code to ensure that all substances are covered by an appropriate regulation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of Chatham Borough, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Chapter 195, Section 33 of the Code of the Borough of Chatham is hereby replaced in full with the following new language:

§195-33 Smoking prohibited.

A. Definitions. As used in this Chapter, the following words shall have the following meanings:

ENCLOSED AREA

All areas between a floor and a ceiling, extending to the outer perimeter walls of a structure.

MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

Shall include all structures owned, leased, rented and/or operated by the Borough of Chatham and/or occupied by Borough employees and used for official business of the Borough.

PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

Shall include all public parks, playgrounds, ball fields, publicly owned or leased by the Borough of Chatham, and all property owned or leased by the Borough of Chatham upon which the public is invited or upon which the public is permitted and where individuals gather for recreational activities, including all areas adjacent to such facilities, including, but not limited to, any parking area, driveway or drive aisle.

SMOKING

The burning of, inhaling from, exhaling the smoke from, or the possession of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or any other matter or substance containing tobacco, marijuana/cannabis, hash, or any other matter or substance that can be smoked, or the inhaling or exhaling of smoke or vapor from an electronic smoking device.

- B. Prohibition of smoking in public places; signs.
 - (1) Smoking shall be prohibited in all municipal buildings as defined herein. Nosmoking signs or the international no-smoking symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a diagonal red line through its cross section) shall be clearly, sufficiently and conspicuously posted at each municipal building entrance and within each closed area where smoking is prohibited by this Chapter. The signs shall be clearly visible to the public and shall contain letters or a symbol which contrast in color with the sign, indicating that smoking is prohibited therein. The sign shall also indicate that violators are subject to a fine.
 - (2) Smoking shall be prohibited within a fifty (50) foot radius of the front entrance of all municipal buildings. No-smoking signs or the international no-smoking symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a diagonal red line through its cross section) shall be clearly, sufficiently and conspicuously posted both on the building and at the fifty (50) foot perimeter of the front entrance of all municipal buildings where smoking is prohibited by this chapter. The signs shall be clearly visible to the public and shall contain letters or a symbol which contrast in color with the sign, indicating that smoking is prohibited therein. The sign shall also indicate that violators are subject to a fine.
 - (3) Smoking shall be prohibited in all public parks and recreation facilities owned or leased by the Borough of Chatham and all property owned or leased by the Borough upon which the public is invited or upon which the public is permitted

and where individuals gather for recreational activities, including all areas adjacent to such facilities, including, but not limited to, any parking area, driveway or drive aisle, which have been designated with no-smoking signs. No-smoking signs or the international no-smoking symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a diagonal red line through its cross section) shall be clearly, sufficiently and conspicuously posted in all areas regulated by this Chapter. The signs shall be clearly visible to the public and shall contain letters or a symbol which contrasts in color with the sign, indicating that smoking is prohibited at the designated area. The sign shall also indicate that violators are subject to a fine.

- (4) Smoking shall be prohibited in any vehicle registered to the Borough of Chatham or leased or rented by the Borough.
- (5) Discarding of products, materials and devices used for smoking, such as cigarette butts, cigar stubs, and similar detritus, within the areas described in Sections 1-4, above, is also prohibited by this Chapter.
- C. Enforcement. The enforcement authority of this Chapter shall be the Police Department, Fire Department, Recreation Department, Public Works Department and Health Department.

Section 2:

All other provisions of Chapter 195 of the Code shall remain unchanged.

Section 3:

Repeal of Inconsistent Provisions. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only however, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same being conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

Section 4:

Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remain in effect; it being the legislative intent this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 5:

Codification. This Ordinance shall be a part of the Code of Borough of Chatham as though codified and fully set forth therein. The Municipal Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code. The Municipal Clerk and the Borough Attorney are authorized and directed to change any Chapter, Article and/or Section number of the Borough Code in the event that the codification of this Ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between

the numbers and the existing Code, and in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions not intended to be repealed.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage, adoption, and publication in the manner prescribed by law.
