**DISCUSSION ITEMS**

Fairview Avenue- Traffic- Traffic Officer George reported on the traffic problems on Fairview Avenue. He stated they did a speed survey from 7:30 to 9:00 am and 2:30 to 4:00 pm and found only a few cars doing over the 25 mile an hour speed limit. Traffic Officer George stated a speed hump or one way street can not be done because Fairview Avenue connects Chatham Borough and Chatham Township, and state law does not permit speed humps on inter - city roads. There was discussion about purchasing a device to show a car's speed.

Traffic Control Ordinances-Traffic Officer George and Mr. DeNave explained the proposed Ordinances for limiting parking on Elmwood Avenue and adding a no left turn onto Main Street. They also discussed removing the no left turns onto Main Street on

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Roosevelt Avenue, Tallmadge Avenue and Coleman Avenue. The Council discussed changes to the Ordinances.

Ogden Church- Mr. DeNave stated he received a new plan from Ogden Church for parking and drop off. He explained the plans.

Koronkiewicz-Sewer Easement- Mr. Lloyd explained the easements that exist on Mrs. Koronkiewicz property and his recommendations. Mr. DeNave explained the depth and placement of the pipe located in the easement. Mr. Lloyd recommended that the matter be addressed by the Planning Board. Mrs. Koronkiewicz explained the addition she proposed. Council President Harris asked what standard the Planning Board would apply in this situation. Mr. Lloyd explained.

4 Connections-Installation of Fiber Optic Lines-Mr. Enzo Clementi explained that the company supplies Fiber Optic cable. They are asking for a Resolution to be passed allowing them to install approximately 1.76 miles of cable on the utility poles on Watchung Avenue, Fairmount Avenue and Main Street. The Council Members had several questions about who could use this cable and the advantages.

Demolition of house on Woodland Park property-Mr. Falzarano stated Mr. Ciccarone the administrator in Chatham Township requested the house on the Woodland Park property be demolished. The Borough and the Township will split the cost 50/50. It will cost approximately \$14,000.00 to demolish the house and approximately \$975 to remove the oil tank. Mayor Plambeck would like the septic system removed at the same time. Mr. Falzarano stated that would be a good time to do that and he would have it done. Mayor Plambeck asked if anyone objects to demolishing the house. Everyone agreed it should be done.

Lum Avenue Project-Construction Management-Mr. DeNave reported there was a pre construction meeting and the contractor will, weather permitting start work in two weeks. The turf should be installed the last week of April when ECLC is on vacation. The field should be open in the beginning of May.

## **COUNCIL LIAISON REPORTS**

### Historic Preservation Commission

Council Member Cordelia O. Fuller reported the December meeting was cancelled

### Local Assistance Board

Council Member Neal Collins reported a meeting is scheduled for January 31<sup>st</sup>.

### Streetscape Committee

Council Member Cordelia O. Fuller reported the next meeting will be on February 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Borough Hall.

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Board of Education

Council Member Joseph Mikulewicz stated there is a tentative contract agreement with the teachers. There is a Budget Advisory Meeting scheduled for February 6th and March 6<sup>th</sup>. The Board of Education is over the budget by approximately \$800,000.00 to \$900,000.00. The redistricting of the school district will be phased in over two years.

Chamber of Commerce

Council Member Richard E. Crater, Jr. reported the Chamber discussed ChathamFest which will be held either the second or third Saturday in June. Plans are being made for Comedy Night in mid April. The Annual Dinner will be held in mid May.

Environmental Commission

Council President Bruce A. Harris reported the Environmental Resources Index is going through final edits and will be published at the next meeting. The annual Sheppard Kollack Park clean up is scheduled for April 21<sup>st</sup>.

Open Space Committee

Council President Bruce A. Harris reported the Open Space Committee is continuing to talk with residents about what they would like done with the Borough paper streets and vacant property.

Planning Board

Council President Bruce A. Harris reported the new Chair is Monty Montague. There has been a lot of progress on the Dunkin Donuts application. They will be on the agenda for the February 14<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Traffic Committee

Council Member James J. Collander reported the meeting was on January 10<sup>th</sup> and Elmwood Avenue was discussed. The next meeting will be February 14<sup>th</sup>.

Recreation Committee

Council Member James J. Collander reported girls Lacrosse sign ups have increased; they have added teams in 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades. They are looking for qualified coaches. Over 1,100 boys and girls have signed up for baseball. A computer has been set up in the Clerk's Office for people who would like to use it to sign up for recreation programs.

Board of Health

Council Member Neal T. Collins reported he attended his first meeting. They discussed the banning of trans fat and smoking in vehicles with minor children present.

Shade Tree Commission

Council Member Richard E. Crater, Jr. reported the meeting was well attended. They discussed planting trees at the library this spring.

## **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Bob Falzarano reported we are continuing to work on the Bulletin Board and training has been completed. Carol Nauta is collecting information to put on the Bulletin Board. Mr. Falzarano asked the public to submit any information they would like posted to Carol Nauta as soon as possible. A draft Mission Statement and Table of Organization has been completed and will be discussed at the February 12<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting. The 2007 Budget is tentatively scheduled for introduction on February 26<sup>th</sup>. The Borough Offices should be finished by the end of the month.

Mayor Plambeck announced that he will not run for Mayor in 2007.

### **MAYOR'S NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT TIME LIMIT**

Hearing of citizens during the Public Comment Sections of the Agenda is an opportunity for any member of the public to be heard about issues which are/are not topics scheduled for Public Hearing tonight. To help facilitate an orderly meeting, and to permit all to be heard, speakers are asked to limit their comments to three minutes.

Bob Leverich of 43 Elmwood Avenue thanked Council Member Collander for his work on the Traffic Safety Committee. He stated he is in favor of the Ordinances but would like them to be in effect only during school hours.

Peter Hoffman of Chatham Township discussed his letter to the editor of the Independent Press on Woodland Park.

Rob Goldberg of 41 Hedges Avenue thanked Mayor Plambeck for his service. He presented the Council with a petition of 200 signatures against Dunkin Donuts. He would

like the Council to pass an Ordinance restricting certain businesses and their hours of operation.

Bernie Vella of 58 North Summit Avenue stated he would like the Council to pass an Ordinance restricting certain businesses. Mr. Vella does not want the no left turns on Roosevelt Avenue and Tallmadge Avenue eliminated.

Alain Charewicz of 82 Fairmount Avenue stated he sent a letter to the Council suggesting liaisons from each neighborhood where there is a recreation field. Council Member Mikulewicz was in favor of the idea.

Joe Marts of 14 Coleman Avenue West thanked Mayor Plambeck for his service. He stated he would like any acquisition of land to be presented to the Open Space Committee before the purchase. Mr. Marts is against the Dunkin Donuts on Hedges Avenue and Main Street. He considers it to be a safety hazard.

Marc Knoll of Ogden Church described new plans received from their engineers.

Peter Hoffman of 17 Elmwood Avenue thanked Mayor Plambeck for his service. Mr. Hoffman asked if there could be a special meeting of the Traffic Safety Committee to review the new plans from Ogden Church.

Donna Cali-Charles of 131 Center Avenue stated that both a counselor and the principal at a PTO meeting she attended knew nothing about Project Community Pride. Ms. Cali-Charles would like to have further discussions on Project Community Pride and also using the Chatham Courier as our official paper. She also had questions about Ordinance #07-06. Mayor Plambeck explained.

Michael Dean of 181 North Passaic Avenue asked about the cost of the demolition of the building at Woodland Park. Mr. Dean had questions about several Ordinances. Mayor Plambeck explained.

Chris Weiss of 70 Elmwood Avenue made some comments about the parking on Elmwood Avenue. He is opposed to a parking lot at the church on the Elmwood Avenue side.

Martha May of 20 Kimball Street thanked the Mayor for his service. Mrs. May would like to see more of the committee meetings televised. Mrs. May would like the Master Plan amended so that no national chains can come into town.

Brenda Hynes of 29 Elmwood Avenue thanked Council Member Collander.
