EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY:

1. Prepare a Family Communications Plan.
2. Practice your emergency plan once a month.
3. Designate a meeting place away from your home for family members to meet in an emergency event.
4. Prepare an emergency kit or a "Go Bag."



THE NEXT TIME DISASTER STRIKES, YOU MAY NOT HAVE MUCH TIME TO ACT.

Whether the emergency is a power outage, winter storm, fire, hurricane, flood or thunderstorm, **the best thing to do is to prepare now.** Include special provisions for children and for disabled family members. Remember, your children may be in school during the emergency. Once you have created a plan, be sure to post it in your home so that all family members can refer to it easily. Practice your emergency plan once a month by holding emergency drills.

The following list will help you get started with a "Go Bag." For a complete list refer to the Chatham Borough Emergency Preparedness Guide on the Borough website chathamborough.org.

- Flashlights & extra batteries
- Battery operated or crank radio
- Bottled water (1 gallon per day per person for 3 days)
- Sanitation supplies (bleach, etc.)
- Canned goods and non-perishable items (3 days supply)
- Manual can opener
- Candles and matches in waterproof container
- First Aid Kit and Prescription Medications
- Extra pet supplies
- Special items for infants, elderly, or disabled family members.

What is Carbon Monoxide?

Carbon monoxide, or CO, is a colorless, tasteless and odorless gas. Because it can't be seen, tasted or smelled, its toxic fumes can kill you before you are even aware that it is present in your home. At lower levels of exposure, CO causes mild effects that are often mistaken for the flu, with symptoms that include headaches, dizziness, disorientation, nausea and fatigue. The effects of CO exposure can vary greatly from person to person depending on age, overall health, and the concentration and length of exposure.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

If your CO alarm sounds, call 911 and evacuate the building.

Install at least one UL (Underwriters Laboratories) rated carbon monoxide detector with an audible warning signal outside of each sleeping area of your home. As of 2017 carbon monoxide detectors are also required in all public buildings. Prior to this change they were only required in residential uses. Carbon monoxide alarms measure levels of CO over time and are designed to sound an alarm before an average healthy adult would experience symptoms. It's possible that you may not be experiencing symptoms when you hear the alarm, but this does not mean that CO is not present. Smoke Detectors

At a minimum, smoke detectors should be located on every floor level and not more than 10 feet from each bedroom. For additional protection, smoke detectors should be placed inside of each sleeping area. If smoke detectors were installed 7-10 years ago, consider replacing them. Don't forget to practice at home fire drills and choose a designated meeting place outside of the home for family evacuations.

Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and change the batteries regularly.

If you have smoke detectors that are powered by a 9-volt battery only it is strongly suggested that they be replaced by smoke detectors that have a 10 year lithium battery for the following reasons:

1. You will not need to change the battery every 6 months.
2. The battery can not be removed from the detector.
3. Many smoke detectors are over 7 years old so it should be replaced anyway.
4. If you were to sell your residence you will no longer pass your certificate of continued occupancy (CCO) inspection with a 9-volt battery type detector.



MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY


ZONE MAP

MAKE SAFETY A PRIORITY

- ◆ The speed limit in Chatham Borough is 25 mph on all local roads, unless marked otherwise.
- ◆ STOP FOR PEDESTRIANS IN A CROSSWALK.
- ◆ DO NOT TEXT WHILE DRIVING. Use a cell phone with a hands-free device.
- ◆ Lock your car and take the key with you; do not leave valuables in plain sight.

SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS NEEDED

The Borough of Chatham is always interested in hiring for both full time and substitute School Crossing Guards for the school year. A paid 20-hour training program is required. If interested please call Kelli Ann McGuire, CBPD at 973-635-8000.

NOISE

Borough Ordinances regulate the hours of outside construction and the use of power equipment by residents, contractors and landscapers. Power equipment may only be used outdoors during the following hours:

- Weekdays: 8:00 am to 7:00 pm
- Saturday: 9:00 am to 6:00 pm
- Sunday: 9:00 am to 6:00 pm (by property occupants only)

PRIVATE ALARM SYSTEMS

Private alarm systems require an annual permit issued by the Police Department. A fee is required and due during the month of January. The applicant and the system must be in compliance with the Borough alarm system regulations.

SNOW REMOVAL

Snow must be removed from public sidewalks within the first 12 hours of daylight from the time the storm ends and must be cleared to a 4 foot width. Please do not plow or place snow onto roadways. Remove ice on sidewalks with salt, and to prevent slip and falls, apply sawdust, sand or ashes within the first 12 hours of daylight after the formation of the ice.

Cars are not allowed to be parked on any street whenever snow has accumulated on the street that snow removal operations will be required. Parking prohibitions remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic. Any vehicle in violation will be towed at the owner's expense.

PARKING INFORMATION

TRAIN STATION ANNUAL PARKING PERMIT

Parking permits for Railroad Station North & South are available to Chatham Borough residents ONLY at a yearly cost of **\$480.00**. There is a waiting list for Annual Parking Permits. When moving out of town, return your parking permit to receive a pro-rated refund.

TRAIN STATION METERED PARKING (Numbered Spots)

Metered parking is available to the public for **\$5.75** per day, motorcycles & scooters **\$2.75** per day. Hours of enforcement are 5:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Friday, except legal holidays.

Metered spaces are numbered and payment can be conveniently made at the kiosk on the station platform using a credit card, debit card, the Park Mobile app or cash. When using cash, exact change should be used. A receipt will be issued as proof of payment.

Register at parkmobile.com to pay for your parking space through Park Mobile, an app accessible through your smart phone or computer.

DAILY PARKING PERMIT

After 9:00 am Monday through Friday, you may obtain a daily parking permit to park in vacant permit spaces (not numbered). Daily Parking Permits can be purchased for **\$5.75** in the Finance Office room 205 at Borough Hall, 54 Fairmount Avenue.

RESIDENT PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM

If you live on a street that has time limit parking, you may apply for a permit to park in front of your house longer than the time limits. (This DOES NOT include overnight parking). If you wish to apply for a resident permit, pick up an application at Borough Hall, Room 205, or download the application at chathamborough.org.

CAREGIVER PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM

For the purpose of this program, a caregiver is a paid helper who regularly looks after a child or sick/elderly/disabled person. See instructions for Resident Parking Permit Program.

ANNUAL CURB & SIDEWALK PROGRAM Chatham Borough officials review the condition of all curbs and sidewalks in the Borough on an annual basis and a listing of curbs and sidewalks requiring repair or replacement is completed before the month of May. Residents can submit a Sidewalk Repair Request Form, available on the Borough website, to the Borough Engineer for consideration, or Report a Concern button on the Borough website.

HOUSEHOLD SOLID WASTE AND BULK WASTE COLLECTION

MANDATORY "PAY AS YOU THROW" HOUSEHOLD SOLID WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

Borough residents are required to use green plastic bags for household solid waste collection. The green bags come in 15- and 30-gallon sizes and are available for purchase at Kings Super Market, Dreyer's Lumber and the Chatham Township ShopRite. **Other plastic garbage bags will not be picked up.**

Green bags must be at the curb before 6:00 am on the day of collection and may be placed at the curb no sooner than 5:00 pm the evening before the day of collection if convenient to do so.

To avoid animal problems or to prevent spillage, green bags can be placed in a container. All containers must be removed from the curb by 7:00 pm on the day of collection.

BULK PICKUP

The Borough provides one bulk pickup per month for each collection route. Pickup is on the first consecutive Thursday and Friday of the month. Please refer to the calendar for scheduled dates.

ROUTE A (streets located north of the rail line) Bulk Pickup is scheduled on Thursdays.

ROUTE B (streets located south of the rail line) Bulk Pickup is scheduled on Fridays.

Bulky items and one 30-gallon container of rubbish may be placed at the curb for pickup.

Items placed in plastic bags will NOT be picked up unless in green bags.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Bulky items such as household appliances (must have Freon removed), furniture, carpeting, luggage, toys and other oversized items too big to fit in a green bag. Rubbish is defined as items such as shoes, baskets, flower pots, etc.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

Recyclables, hazardous waste, medical waste, car parts, tires, concrete, cement block, wood framing and wood pieces in excess of 5 feet by 2 feet in size, construction debris, windows, batteries.

CODE ENFORCEMENT CONSTRUCTION & ZONING

CONSTRUCTION PERMITS

Most renovation and alteration projects require a permit. The Madison Building & Construction Department handles the processing and issuance of building and construction permits for Chatham Borough, and schedules all subcode inspections to ensure that all work has been performed in accordance with the Uniform Construction Code as adopted by the State of New Jersey. It may be beneficial to contact the Madison Building & Construction Department at 973-593-3064 before you plan a construction project.

DEMOLITION PERMITS

The dismantling, destruction or removal of any structure, or part of a structure, requires official zoning approval. Contact the Chatham Borough Engineer & Zoning office if you are interested in razing a structure. Once zoning approval has been obtained a demolition permit will be required. The Madison Building & Construction Department handles the processing and issuance of demolition permits for Chatham Borough, and can be reached at 973-593-3064.

ZONING AND LAND USE MATTERS

Inquiries concerning zoning and land disturbance matters, such as reviews for signage, fences, driveways, patios, sheds, building setbacks, lot requirements are handled by the Chatham Borough Engineer & Zoning office. Guidance will be given on whether formal zoning approval is required or a zoning permit is needed for a project.

HOME IMPROVEMENT CONTRACTORS

Before retaining a home improvement contractor, make sure they are registered with the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs to perform work in the state. You can perform a search on the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs' website for license verification of a contractor.

Home improvement contractors are individuals and companies involved in repairing, renovating, modernizing, installing, replacing, improving, restoring, painting, constructing, remodeling, moving, or demolishing residential or noncommercial properties.

Home improvement contractors include those who work on residential driveways, sidewalks, swimming pools, terraces, patios, additions, landscaping, fences, porches, windows, doors, cabinets, kitchens, bathrooms, garages, finished basements, basement waterproofing, insulation installation, roofing and siding, wall-to-wall carpeting or attached or inlaid floor coverings, and more.

It is in your best interest to ensure the contractor is licensed and receives the proper permits.

VOTER REGISTRATION & ELECTION DAY INFORMATION

VOTER REGISTRATION

Individuals are eligible to register to vote if they are a citizen of the United States and will be 18 years of age on or before the next election.

New voters and residents who have moved to Chatham Borough from another state or from another county in New Jersey will need to file a voter registration application with the Morris County Board of Elections. Registered voters who have moved within Morris County must also update their voter registration with a change of address.

Voter Registration applications are available at the Clerk's office or may be printed from the Borough website.

POLLING LOCATIONS IN CHATHAM BOROUGH

Registered voters are assigned a specific Election District and polling place according to their street address. Registered voters can find their Election District and polling place printed on the face of the Sample Ballot mailed the week before election day.

MAIL-IN BALLOTS (formerly known as Absentee Ballots)

A voter may apply to vote by a Mail-In Ballot for any election. Vote by Mail-In Ballot applications are available at the Chatham Borough Clerk's Office and the Borough website. Once the Vote by Mail-Ballot application is received and approved by the Morris County Board of Elections, the election ballot with instructions for completion will be mailed to the voter at the address indicated on the application. The voter will not be allowed to vote at a polling location.

BECOMING A POLL WORKER FOR ELECTIONS

Earn extra income while performing an important civic function. Morris County election officials hire registered voters to work at the polls.

Poll workers earn **\$200** for each election day worked. Interested individuals should submit an application with the Morris County Board of Elections and complete a 2-hour training. Classes are held in May and October at many locations throughout the county prior to election days.

PLANNING BOARD

The Chatham Borough Planning Board functions under the authority of the Municipal Land Use Law of New Jersey, N.J.S.A. 40:55 D and Borough Code, Chapter 165 Land Development.

Planning Board approval is required for applications that involve:

- Site plans
- Subdivisions
- Conditional use applications

The Planning Board is empowered to review and approve "C" variances in conjunction with development applications. The Planning Board is also responsible for reviewing and making recommendations on land use zoning ordinances of the Borough and reexamining and updating the Borough's Master Plan.

The Chatham Borough Planning Board meets twice monthly on the first and third Wednesday of every month at 7:30 pm in Borough Hall.

MASTER PLAN

A Master Plan is a community-wide land use policy guide adopted by the Planning Board. This Plan sets the vision and blueprint for the community's growth, revitalization, and preservation. It is not a law or a mandate. It does, however, contain the goals that inform zoning and public decision-making around development, preservation, and infrastructure. Importantly, a Master Plan Reexamination also acknowledges the major challenges relating to land use policy and development, as well as significant changes in policies at a variety of scales, including changes in state and county policy directions. The Borough's last Master Plan Reexamination and Update Report was adopted by the Planning Board in 2016 and is available on the Borough website.

REDEVELOPMENT

During early 2019, the Borough adopted redevelopment plans for both the Post Office Plaza and River Road Redevelopment Areas. Developers were designated for both projects due to their site control and initial concept plans during the summer. Proposals for both projects conducted public, fiscal and design analysis in the fall of 2019.

It is expected that both projects will complete Borough Council review, including potential redevelopment and financial agreements, in early 2020. Following this process, they will be able to proceed with Planning Board application.

ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The Zoning Board of Adjustment's powers are very specific and different from the Planning Board. The Zoning Board of Adjustment is often called a "quasi-judicial" body and its principal duties are to hear and decide on requests for interpretations of the Borough's zoning and land development ordinances. Like the Planning Board, the Chatham Borough Zoning Board of Adjustment functions under the authority of the Municipal Land Use Law of New Jersey, N.J.S.A. 40:55 D and Borough Code, Chapter 165 Land Development.

The Chatham Borough Zoning Board of Adjustment meets monthly on the fourth Wednesday of every month at 7:30 pm in Borough Hall.

Variance requests that are considered by the Zoning Board of Adjustment Include:

A & B Variances

An "A" variance application is filed when an applicant believes that the Borough's Zoning Officer has erred in denying a request for a permit based on the Borough's land development ordinances. The Zoning Board is also responsible for interpretations of the zoning ordinance and the zoning map on questions related to whether or not a specific use is permitted. This type of variance is called a "B" variance.

C Variance

The most common type of variance heard by the Zoning Board of Adjustment is a variance from the bulk and dimensional requirements of the ordinance, referred to as a "C" variance or "bulk" variance. This is a commonly requested variance in town, generally associated with construction of single-family dwellings, accessory structures and additions. When building or expanding, a "C" variance may be needed because existing constraints of the property, size, area, shape or topographic conditions may prevent compliance with the zoning regulations for that property.

D Variance

Where an applicant is seeking a use that is not permitted by the zoning ordinance, the applicant is required to obtain a "D" variance or "use" variance. There are six different kinds of "D" variances. An applicant seeking a "D" variance must show the property is particularly suitable for the proposed use and that the variance can be granted without causing substantial detriment to the public good and won't substantially impair the intent and purpose of the municipal zoning ordinance and municipal Master Plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION

The Borough of Chatham Environmental Commission is an advisory board created to protect our natural resources. The Commission gathers information, communicates with other Borough agencies and our residents, and encourages our community to appreciate and enjoy our environment. The Commission also recommends to the Mayor and Council ways that Chatham Borough can become more environmentally sustainable.

The Environmental Commission is concerned with clean air and water, environmental quality, waste management, and land and wildlife preservation. Recent Commission projects include the Historic Riverside Trail at Shepard Kollock Park, recommending to the Borough Council the passage of the Plastic Bags Ordinance set to take effect on March 1st, and recommending to the Borough Council that it suspend use of non-organic pesticides on playing fields.

Environmental Commission meetings are held the second Wednesday of each month at 8:00 pm in Borough Hall. The annual Trail Cleanup is held every April. Residents are welcomed to participate in all Commission events and attend its monthly meetings in Room 212, Middle Level at Borough Hall, except as otherwise indicated in the calendar. The Commission does not meet in August.

GREEN TEAM

BECOME A MEMBER OF THE "GREEN TEAM"!

The "Green Team" is a sub-committee of the Environmental Commission that plans, coordinates, and prepares the Chatham Borough submission to the Sustainable Jersey municipal sustainability certification program. It leads efforts to educate our community on how to become more sustainable. 448 municipalities throughout New Jersey are registered with Sustainable Jersey and 210 are certified at the Bronze or Silver level.

CONTAMINATED RECYCLING

Plastic bags are NOT to be placed in your single stream recycling, even if those bags contain your recycled items. The plastic bags contaminate the quality of paper and cardboard sent overseas for reuse and recycler's work force cannot possibly remove every plastic bag out of the stream of recyclables. If a paper/cardboard shipment is rejected, the Borough is charged for the price of transport due to the contaminated shipment being rejected. Effective 3/1/20, retail establishments will be prohibited from providing single use plastic bags to carry goods home. Until the Plastic Bags Ordinance takes effect on 3/1/20 and until you have single-use plastic bags available, return plastic bags to supermarket collection bins. Make every effort to use cloth reusable bags for multiple uses and remember to periodically wash them.

SHADE TREE COMMISSION

The Chatham Borough Shade Tree Commission was established in 1909. The Commission's responsibilities include planting and maintaining trees along Borough streets, public right-of-ways, and in the Borough parks and open spaces. Street trees along Fairmount Avenue, North Passaic Avenue and Watchung Avenue are maintained by Morris County. It is the goal of the Shade Tree Commission to create and maintain optimum tree cover and tree species diversity, while also maintaining a pruning and removal program to keep our streets and parks attractive and safe.

Chatham Borough has been designated a Tree City USA community since May 2001.

The Chatham Borough Shade Tree Commission meets monthly on the third Tuesday of every month at 7:30 pm in Borough Hall.

HOW TO REQUEST THE PLANTING OF A STREET TREE

The Shade Tree Commission is always looking for opportunities to plant new trees to replace those that have been lost to age, disease or stormy weather over the years, and budgets funds each year to plant new trees along our streets and in our parks. A limited number of trees are available each year on a first come, first serve basis and are planted during the fall season. Residents requesting a street tree planting should submit a Tree Service Request form to the Shade Tree Commission, or through Report a Concern both available on the Borough website at chathamborough.org.

HOW TO REQUEST THE EVALUATION OF A STREET TREE

Residents who have concerns about a street tree or a tree in one of our parks should submit a Tree Service Request form to the Shade Tree Commission for evaluation. The form is available on the Borough website at chathamborough.org.

EMERGENCY TREE SITUATIONS

Snow, wind, lightning storms, or other emergency situations may arise and require the immediate removal of a street tree. During normal business hours, call the Public Works Department at 973-635-5242; otherwise call the Police Department at 973-635-8000.

TREE PROTECTION & PRESERVATION ORDINANCE

Chatham Borough adopted a Tree Protection & Preservation Ordinance that requires property owners to acquire a permit (\$25.00 application fee) before removing any tree on private property. A Tree Removal Application, available on the Borough website at chathamborough.org, is filed with the Department of Community Services. The Borough's Enforcement Official will visit the location and inspect the land and trees in order to determine the effect of the destruction or removal upon drainage, soil stability and growth and development of the remaining trees on the land and adjacent property. The Enforcement Officer will conditionally grant or deny the request based on the inspection. The homeowner may be required to replace the tree, or make a donation, based on the Enforcement Officer's findings.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

The purpose of the Historic Preservation Commission is to encourage the continuation of the Borough's grace and charm through preservation of its historic character.

The Chatham Borough Historic Preservation Commission meets monthly on the third Tuesday of every month at 7:30 pm in Borough Hall.

Chatham was initially settled in 1715 and throughout the years Main Street has grown rich with historic buildings and architecture. In 1973, the portion of Main Street extending from the Borough's eastern boundary west to Lafayette Avenue was named a Historic District on the New Jersey Register of Historic Places. Any building project involving new construction, exterior changes, or demolition to any existing structure, or part of a structure, within the Historic District, must file an application and appear before the Commission. The Historic Preservation Commission then prepares a Review Report for the Zoning Board of Adjustment and/or Planning Board with its findings and recommendations. Persons considering applications are encouraged to request informal informational meetings with the Commission prior to filing an application.

In 1994, the Historic Preservation Commission published a Design Guidelines Manual to assist property owners, retailers and developers in planning their projects and to help in projects of a seemingly minor nature. It also answers questions regarding the history or architecture of a number of Chatham's buildings and streets. The booklet is available in Chatham Borough's Clerk's Office or in the reference section of the Library of the Chathams. This manual is currently being updated.

SENIOR SERVICES CENTER OF THE CHATHAMS

Senior Services Center of the Chathams (SSC) is a not-for-profit corporation that has been supporting the independence of our senior community since 1990. For 29 years, we have helped older adults age in place by providing an enrichment center, door-to-door bus transportation, supportive counseling and information and referral services. It is our mission to protect and preserve the independence and dignity of a growing aging population by providing a wide array of programs and services that educate, empower, and connect participants to one another.

SSC offers programs that promote wellness and healthy lifestyles: monthly blood pressure, and other health screenings, monthly nutrition lectures, balance workshops, and daily exercise and fitness classes (tone & flex, yoga, tai chi). We recently added social dancing, meditation and pickleball. SSC offers a wide variety of discussion and support groups: a weekly men's group, a Reflections group for women, and a monthly dementia support group for family and caregivers.

The Senior bus is available to Chatham residents age 60+ and/or disabled, who are able to board and exit the bus unassisted. Hours of operation will be 9:15am to 1:45pm on Tu, Th & F unless otherwise noted on the calendar. We provide bus service to and from the Senior Center and the Morris County Nutrition sites in Chatham and Madison, as well as to/from the Madison Y once daily on the days of regular operation. Weekly trips to ShopRite and once monthly trips to malls will be available on a fixed-schedule basis. For more info call (973) 635-4565 or go to chathamseiorcenter.org

CURBSIDE RECYCLING - RECYCLING DEPOT - HAZARDOUS WASTE RECYCLING

“ALL-IN-ONE” SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING

“All-in-one” single-stream recycling allows aluminum & steel cans, glass bottles/jars, plastic bottles/containers coded #1, #2 & #5, paper, junk-mail, newspaper and cardboard mixed together for recycling. Bottles/cans & boxes must be empty and free of food residue. Please flatten all cardboard boxes (remove foam and plastic packaging, which is not acceptable in curbside recycling program).



The MUA does not accept plastic grocery bags. These plastic bags jam the sorting mechanisms at the recycling facility. Most grocery stores will accept plastic grocery bags in specially-marked bins.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING PICK UP EVERY FRIDAY (except holidays)

Recycling containers should be placed at the curb before 6:00am on the day of collection. The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (MUA) collects recyclable materials in Chatham Borough at curbside. The MUA recommends using 32-gallon containers with lids and handles for “all-in-one” single stream recycling collection. Containers must not exceed 50 lb. in weight. If necessary, use multiple containers for recyclables. **Please refer to Page 25 in this Borough Calendar for more information on what items can and cannot be recycled.**

CHATHAM BOROUGH RECYCLING DEPOT

The Borough’s recycling depot, located at 90 Summit Avenue, is open to Borough residents every Saturday from 9:00am to 12:00pm.

2020 FALL LEAF COLLECTION & MULCH SITE SCHEDULE

LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE

The Department of Public Works will be collecting leaves at the curb WEEKLY throughout the Borough using the vacuum method from October 19th through November 30th.

Please do not place leaves at the curb after Sunday night, November 29th. The final curbside collection of leaves will take place the week of Monday, November 30th. Once the vacuum crews have passed your house they will not return for the season.

LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- **RAKE LEAVES TO YOUR PROPERTY LINE. PLEASE DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET.** Leaves should be placed at the curb or street edge not more than 5 feet from the roadway.
- **NO DIRT, ROCKS, BRANCHES OR TREE LIMBS.** These materials pose serious hazards to employees and can cause costly damage to leaf collection equipment.
- **KEEP LEAVES AWAY FROM CULVERTS AND STORM DRAINS.** The DEP has instituted Municipal Stormwater Regulations. Part of the regulations mandate that the Borough enforce the ordinance **prohibiting the placement of yard waste and leaves in the road or within ten (10) feet of any storm sewer inlet. Please take notice: Tickets will be issued on first occurrences.**
- **COLLECTION OF PAPER LEAF BAGS: DECEMBER 8TH AND DECEMBER 15TH**
On Tuesday, December 8th and Tuesday, December 15th, the Borough will pick up paper leaf bags that are placed at curbside. Residents are responsible for purchasing biodegradable paper bags.



FOR RESIDENTS AND THEIR LANDSCAPE COMPANIES

Residents hiring landscape companies should instruct their landscaper to place leaves at the street edge or curb in accordance with this leaf collection schedule and guidelines.

Landscapers may also make arrangements to bring leaves collected from Borough residence properties to the mulch site on weekdays, free of charge. No landscapers are permitted on Saturdays. Landscapers must contact the Department of Public Works at 973-635-5242 to sign up for this free program.

2020 MULCH SITE RULES & HOURS OF OPERATION

Starting October 19th and ending December 5th, the mulch site, located on Duchamp Place behind the Milton Avenue School, will be open:

Monday - Friday 8:00 am to 4:00 pm (closed for lunch 11:45 am to 1:00 pm).

Wednesday, November 25th open 8:00 am - 12:00 pm

Closed November 26th and November 27th

Last day the mulch site will be open for the season:

Saturday, December 5, 2020 open 12:00 pm - 4:00 pm

Please note that Duchamp Place and Elmwood Avenue are one-way streets heading south on school days and cannot be used to access the mulch site. Please watch for children.

BOROUGH RESIDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO OBTAIN A PERMIT TO ACCESS THE MULCH SITE. No one will be admitted without a valid permit. Permits can be obtained from the DPW at the mulch site.

THE FOLLOWING YARD MATERIALS MAY BE DISPOSED OF AT THE MULCH SITE:

GRASS, LEAVES, HEDGE CLIPPINGS, and TREE LIMBS UP TO 4" IN DIAMETER
Grass may be disposed of but must be separated from all other mulched items. Plastic bags or containers must be removed from the site.

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED AT THE MULCH SITE:

STUMPS, HOUSEHOLD REFUSE, CONCRETE, BUILDING MATERIALS, METAL FURNITURE, FENCE MATERIALS, LANDSCAPE TIES, LUMBER, and TREE LIMBS IN EXCESS OF 4" IN DIAMETER

The NJDEP requires that only acceptable yard materials may be disposed of at the mulch site. Failure to comply with NJDEP regulations may result in the closing of the mulch site.

WOOD CHIPS and PROCESSED MULCH

WOOD CHIPS and PROCESSED MULCH are available free of charge to residents. Residents who have a need for large quantities may have it delivered for a small fee of either \$30 or \$50 per load. Call the DPW office 973-635-5242 to schedule delivery.

CHATHAM BOROUGH BOARD OF HEALTH

The Borough of Chatham Board of Health was established by ordinance in 1898 at the time of the Borough's incorporation as a municipality. The Board is comprised of seven members who are responsible for ensuring the development and implementation of public health policy and programs. In New Jersey, every municipality is required to be served by a local health department that meets the requirements of state public health laws and regulations.

The Board of Health provides essential environmental and public health services that protect and promote individual and community health. Board members fulfill their responsibilities as public officials by addressing the ever increasing barrage of public health issues such as influenza, lyme disease, and emerging pathogens, tobacco control, public health preparedness, and environmental matters. The board is an active member of the New Jersey Local Boards of Health Association.

The Board of Health meetings are held on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in Borough Hall. The public is invited to attend the meetings.

PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

Chatham Borough contracts public health services through the Westfield Regional Department of Health. Under the mandates of the New Jersey Public Health Practice Standards and the ordinances and policies of the Chatham Borough Board of Health, public health is protected through sanitary inspections, enforcement activities, disease prevention, health promotion, and education programs scheduled throughout the year.

To report a concern or complaint about a public health matter, please contact the Board of Health Secretary, Melanie Politi, at mpoliti@chathamborough.org. SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

EASY THINGS YOU CAN DO EVERY DAY TO PROTECT OUR WATER

LIMIT YOUR USE OF FERTILIZERS AND PESTICIDES

- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer. Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- When using fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label for correct application.
- Properly store or discard any unused portions.
- Use organic products where feasible, in the long-term, organics will save you money.
- Consider whether doing nothing to your lawn is an option.



PROPERLY USE AND DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

- Do not pour hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local water bodies and the water is not treated.
- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Contact the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority to dispose of hazardous waste products. See page 21.

PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET AND DISPOSE OF PET WASTE PROPERLY

Some storm drain inlets are marked with messages that the storm drain is connected to local water bodies. Never discard pet waste in a storm drain. Be a good neighbor and properly dispose of pet waste. Use newspaper, bags, or pooper scoopers to pickup waste. Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or, if unwrapped, in a toilet. Violators may be fined.

DON'T FEED WILDLIFE

- Feeding of wildlife, such as ducks, geese, deer, and squirrels is prohibited in public areas.

DISPOSE OF YARD WASTE PROPERLY

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- Follow all yard waste collection rules.
- Whenever possible, compost leaves, grass clippings and small twigs.
- Grass clippings left on your lawn acts as a natural fertilizer as long as you cut your grass to a 2-1/2-3 inch height.



PLEASE, DO NOT LITTER

- Please use trash and recycling receptacles and do your part to recycle!
- Please keep lids on all recycling and trash receptacles to prevent litter.
- Participate in community cleanups.

HEALTHY HABITS FOR CLEANER WATER

Storm water pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean water.

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, grass clippings, pet waste: you name it and it ends up in our water.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of storm water. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it becomes polluted.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to storm water pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.

CHATHAM BOROUGH GOVERNMENT

The Borough form of Government under which Chatham operates provides for a mayor and six council members. The mayor serves a 4-year term, while each year two of the six council members are elected to 3-year terms. All elections are partisan. The mayor and council members are not paid for their service and do not receive stipends, health or pension benefits.

Mayor and Council meetings are open to the public. Regular business meetings are generally held on the second and fourth Monday (unless Monday is a holiday) of each month at 7:30 p.m. in Borough Hall, 54 Fairmount Avenue.

MAYOR

The mayor maintains order, executes state laws and local ordinances, makes personnel appointments with the advice and consent of the Borough Council, and recommends measures to assure the welfare of the Borough. The mayor presides at Borough Council meetings but has no vote except in case of a tie. He or she may veto measures, but the Council may override the veto by a two-thirds vote. By right of office the mayor serves as a member of all Borough committees.

BOROUGH COUNCIL

The duties of the six-member Borough Council include passing local ordinances and resolutions, awarding contracts for public works, approving appointments made by the mayor, making appointments as provided by law, setting the budget and tax levy, and handling bond issues.

The six Council Committees are:

Budget and Finance: Financial oversight and planning; preparation of the budget; review of fees.

Public Works Planning/Community Services: Public Works services, infrastructure planning, solid waste, recycling services, community out-reach, and Borough-sponsored programs, activities and events.

Personnel: Salary and benefits for all personnel; administrative personnel matters.

Public Safety and Emergency Services: Oversight of police, coordination with Emergency Squad and Fire Department.

Shared Services and 3rd Party Agreements: Evaluation and management of shared service arrangements; Service on shared services management committees: Joint Court, Madison Chatham Joint Meeting, Construction Office, Department of Health and DPW equipment sharing.

Long Range Traffic & Pedestrian Safety Planning: Planning of street traffic, sidewalk and parking practices and improvements.
