
NOTICE: **UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION WORK ON WATER SERVICE LINES IN YOUR AREA**

Dear Resident or Property Owner:

This letter is to serve as notice that the Borough of Chatham Water Department, pursuant to New Jersey State Law P.L.2021, Ch. 183 (commonly known as the Lead Service Line Replacement Act), will be conducting lead service line identification and replacement work for the water service lines on Washington Avenue between Main Street and Watchung Avenue beginning 2/12/2024. This work will occur ahead of planned roadway pavement for your street in 2024.

This work is intended to identify and replace any lead service lines currently still in use. Please note that due to the location of these water mains and service lines below grade, access to your streets may be temporarily affected and restricted only to local traffic during typical construction hours. Construction vehicles will also be present on these streets during this time.

The Borough of Chatham Department of Public Works will be replacing their portion of all lead service lines on these streets (see illustration below). Should lead be found on the portion owned by the resident/property owner, proper documentation will be provided detailing next steps and options for the property owner. During the time of this replacement, there will be the potential for temporary water-shutoffs. Any residents at home at the time will be notified of the impending shut-off in person in advance.



Should lead be found on the owner side of the service line, it is the responsibility of the owner to coordinate replacement. The Borough will be providing pre-negotiated pricing at a later date to customers whose service lines have been identified as lead.
