REPORTS:

- 1. Nursing Report: Public Health Nurse Bridget Colendenski gave the Nursing report.
 - a) In April there was a virtual public health webinar they attended.
 - a) An Audit was conducted at Milton Avenue School
 - b) An Audit was completed at Saint Patrick's School
 - c) They had a pop-up clinic for COVID vaccinations, office clinics, and child health clinics.
 - d) The public health emergency has ended for COVID; emergency Medicaid coverage has also ended. There will no longer be free testing, and over-the-counter testing will be available for purchase. Westfield still has free tests available.
 - e) COVID vaccination discussion

2. R.E.H.S. Report: Beau Preston gave the REHS report.

- a) Reinspection of some of the restaurants deemed conditional; they are now in compliance.
- b) There was a heat complaint, which was around May 1. The heat was still on in the apartment complex, and there is really no action warranted unless there is no heat.
- 3. Animal Control Report:
 - a) The Board reviewed the report, including a lost dog and a dog fight.
- 4. Health Officer Monthly Update: Health Officer Megan Avallone read the report.
 - a) Megan and others submitted testimony to the Senate health Committee in support of the NJ Bill S2413/A4115, and it passed unanimously.
 - b) Anticipating a large tick population due to the mild winter; the lone star tick is a more aggressive tick, and we are seeing more of them in our area. They have prepared a spreadsheet for insect repellent guidance.
 - c) The NY Times had an article on lessons learned, or that we should have learned during the pandemic; she will send via email.
- 5. Kay reviewed the LEMC emergency planning training "Tornado Emergency" event held here at Borough Hall in conjunction with FEMA.
