RESOLUTION #16-237

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE 10^{TH} ANNUAL TURN THE TOWNS TEAL® CAMPAIGN, A NATIONAL CAMPAIGN PROMOTING AWARENESS OF OVARIAN CANCER AND ITS SYMPTOMS

WHEREAS, ovarian cancer is the fifth leading cause of cancer-related death among women in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that in 2016, about 22,280 new cases of ovarian cancer will be diagnosed in the United States and that 14,240 women will die of ovarian cancer; and

WHEREAS, ovarian cancer is called the "silent disease" because its symptoms are often vague or subtle; and

WHEREAS, if detected in its early stages, the survival from ovarian cancer is 90-95 percent, yet the relative five-year survival rate for ovarian cancer is 46 percent because it is so difficult to detect early. Survival rates vary greatly depending on the stage of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, the Turn The Towns Teal®, a national campaign to promote awareness of ovarian cancer and its symptoms, was the inspiration of Gail MacNeil of Chatham, New Jersey during her 10-year battle with ovarian cancer. This campaign continues to go forward in her name and in her honor; and

WHEREAS, Turn The Towns Teal[®] and the Ovarian Cancer Research Fund Alliance (OCRFA) are partnering to promote awareness of ovarian cancer through the Turn The Towns Teal[®] campaign; and

WHEREAS, the month of September is dedicated to raising awareness of ovarian cancer.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that they hereby support the Turn The Towns Teal[®] campaign, a national campaign to promote awareness of ovarian cancer and its symptoms campaign, and authorize the placement of teal colored ribbons around Borough trees during the month of September; and
