WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham, the Township of Chatham, the Township of Harding, the Borough of Madison, and the Township of Morris have indicated a desire to renew their participation to operate a Joint Municipal Court, known as "The Joint Municipal Court of Madison, the Chathams, Harding and Morris Township" and to utilize the court facilities at the Hartley Dodge Memorial (Madison Borough Hall) at Kings Road in Madison in accordance with the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council deems it appropriate to authorize renewal into an agreement for a Joint Municipal Court with the Borough of Madison, the Township of Chatham, the Township of Harding and the Township of Morris for a four (4) year period, beginning January 1, 2018 and ending December 31, 2021, subject to the concurrence and approval of the Assignment Judge, Superior Court of New Jersey, Morris County.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council have received a proposal from Sarah W. Stanley to restore the weathered sign at Stanley Park and to remove the overgrown shrubs around the base of the sign with the replanting of low maintenance perennials; and

WHEREAS, Sarah W. Stanley is a descendant of Francis Edgar Page, who was a first cousin to George Shepard Page, a successful businessman who acquired several hundred acres in Chatham in 1867 and named his extensive holdings "Stanley;" and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stanley will fund and manage the restoration of the Stanley Park sign in honor of George Shepard Page; and

WHEREAS, the Chatham Borough Shade Tree Commission has approved the request remove the overgrown shrubs and to replace them with low maintenance perennials; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council wish to approve this request.
