WHEREAS, individuals with autism often require a lifetime of specialized and community support services to ensure their health and safety and to support families' resilience as they manage the psychological and financial burdens autism can present; and

WHEREAS, Autism New Jersey is spearheading an awareness effort in order to educate parents, professionals and the general public about autism and its effects.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that they do hereby celebrate the month of April 2017 as National Autism Awareness, Acceptance and Inclusion Month in the Borough of Chatham, and urge all citizens to become better educated about autism and participate in efforts to create a better community for individuals with autism.

Ms. DeRosa provided a brief description of the role of the Chatham Board of Health, highlighted the accomplishments of Board of Health member, Dr. Norman Schaefer and Public Health Nurse, Marlene Dolan and thanked the Mayor and Council for the Proclamation and their continued support of the Board of Health and its public health programs.

Council Member Collander made a motion to approve Resolution #17-147. Council Member Resto seconded the motion. A vote was taken and Resolution #17-147 was approved unanimously.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

JCP&L Tree Trimming and Circuit Updates – Mr. Rob Walton, representing Jersey Central Power & Light ("JCP&L"), reported that JCP&L's 2017 Capital Budget is \$358,000,000. He added that \$11,000,000 is being dedicated for communication equipment in order to remotely restore and/or redirect circuits to restore power sooner. Mr. Walton further reported that tree trimming along the Academy Substation circuit is scheduled for the beginning of May. Tree trimming will take place along the 34,500 kilovolt line from Traynor Substation to the substation at the old Merck site in Summit. Mr. Walton stated that he had met with the Chair of the Chatham Borough Shade Tree Commission who approved the tree trimming path. Lastly, Mr. Walton reported that tree trimming at the Traynor Substation will being in 2019.

Council President Fife commented on the Post Office Plaza Planning Study. She stated that the Planning Board hired a planner to conduct the Post Office Planning Study. A draft of the study will be presented to the Planning Board on Wednesday, April 5th at 7:30 p.m. She encouraged residents to attend the meeting, to familiarize themselves with the study, ask questions and provide input. She stated that the purpose of the initial study will determine if Post Office Plaza is an area in need of redevelopment. She added that the Borough has reached out to the business and property owners for their input.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Mayor Harris opened the meeting to the public.

Fran Drew, 32 Inwood Road, encouraged the Mayor and Council to inquire with JCP&L, the ability and cost to move Borough powerlines underground or to create solar camps. She also commented on a

sidewalk project pending in Chatham Township and requested that the Mayor and Council research the project to confirm that Chatham Borough trees will not be removed without the permission of the Borough.

Seeing no one else wishing to comment, Mayor Harris closed the meeting to the public.

REPORTS

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Budget and Finance – Council Member Lonergan reported that the 2017 budget is scheduled for introduction tonight. He reported that Moody's has given the Borough a Aaa rating. Chatham Borough is one of 16 towns in New Jersey to have achieved Moody's Aaa rating.

Long Range Traffic & Pedestrian Safety Planning - Council Member Collander has nothing new to report.

Public Safety & Emergency Services - Council Member Collander reported on Police Department statistics, comparing 2017 data to 2016 data.

Personnel - Council Member Resto had nothing new to report.

Public Works Planning/Community Services - Council President Fife reported that the Department of Public Works has been able to save costs by completing projects without the need to hire contractors. The Department of Public Works has been working on the Weston Avenue footbridge, Kelley's Pond, and the Shepard Kollock footpath. She further reported that the Department of Community Services continues to work on the Liberty Park project with the Department of Public Works. Lastly, she reported that the 2017 Spring Clean is scheduled for Saturday, May 6th.

Shared Services & 3rd Party Agreements - Council Member Helfrich reported the committee is presently working with the Board of Health on a public health service agreement that is scheduled for Council consideration at the April 11th meeting of the Mayor and Council.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Harris reported that a conference call with the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT") is scheduled for next week to discuss traffic management ideas for Routes 124 and 124 (Main Street). Mayor Harris further reported that a letter was sent to NJ Transit requesting an update on NJ Transit's investigation into train overpass maintenance. Lastly, Mayor Harris stated that a formal hearing on the 2017 budget is scheduled for the April 24th meeting of the Mayor and Council and that the Board of Education will present the District Budget at the April 24th meeting. He added that he will not be in attendance at the next meeting and that Council President Fife will preside over the meeting in his absence.

Council President Fife commented that the clock in Reasoner Park will soon be removed for refurbishment by Jeff Davis of Specialized Auto Craft. She stated the clock will be reinstalled before the Fishawack Festival.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Falzarano reiterated that Chatham Borough received a Aaa bond rating from Moody's and that the Borough received praise for following its 10-year Strategic Plan, measuring the actual numbers against what was predicted and for the focus on building reserves.

Mayor Harris asked Council Member Lonergan to proceed with Resolution #17-148.
