RESOLUTION TO APPROVE PAYMENT OF VOUCHERS

WHEREAS, vouchers for payment have been submitted to the Borough Council by the various municipal departments.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Chatham that all vouchers approved by the Finance Chairman be paid subject to the certification of the availability of funds by the Chief Financial Officer.

RESOLUTION #20-167

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO ISSUE THIRD QUARTER
“ESTIMATED” TAX BILLS, DUE ON AUGUST 1, 2020**

WHEREAS, in light of the disruption caused by the coronavirus outbreak, the State delayed the adoption of the State Fiscal Year 2021 Budget to September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) cannot certify State Aid allocations to municipal budgets until State Aid Appropriations are known; and

WHEREAS, the DLGS cannot approve municipal budgets and the County Board of Taxation cannot certify taxes until long after the June 30, 2020 deadline to process third quarter tax bills due August 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, without an adopted 2020 Municipal Budget and a 2020 Certified Tax Rate, the Tax Collector cannot process the final 2020 Tax Levy; and

WHEREAS, the DLGS “strongly recommends” under Local Finance Notice 2020-07 “that municipalities prepare to issue estimated property tax bills for 2020;” and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector, in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer, has computed an estimated Tax Levy necessary to bill third quarter taxes due August 1, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Chatham, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey on this 11th day of May 2020 that the Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to process estimated tax bills for the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10, 2020 or the twenty-fifth (25) calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.

RESOLUTION #20-168

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF JUNE 2020 AS LGBTQ PRIDE MONTH IN THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM

WHEREAS, our nation was founded on the principle of equal rights for all people and some of the most inspiring moments in our history have arisen from the various civil rights movements that have brought one group after another from the margins to the mainstream of American society; and

WHEREAS, in the movement towards equal rights for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgendered and questioning (LGBTQ) people, history was made some 51 years ago on June 28, 1969, in New York City, with the onset of the Stonewall Inn Uprising. During this uprising, LGBTQ citizens rose up and fought against the discriminatory criminal laws which have since been declared unconstitutional; and

WHEREAS, all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights and LGBTQ individuals have had an immeasurable impact to the cultural, civic and economic successes of the United States and the world; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham is committed to supporting visibility, dignity and equality for LGBTQ people as part of the increasingly rich mosaic of diversity in Chatham Borough; and

WHEREAS, while society at large is increasingly supporting LGBTQ equality and dignity, it is essential to acknowledge that the need for education and awareness remains vital; and

WHEREAS, the LGBTQ community having made great strides since 1969 still faces challenges in being accepted, in not having equal protection under the law in 39 states, and in parents still rejecting their own children when they come out of the closet as LGBTQ individuals; and

WHEREAS, the struggle of LGBTQ youth with their sexual orientation is a major cause of the teen suicide rate being unacceptably high; and

WHEREAS, this nation was founded on the principle that every individual has inherent dignity and worth and is thus to be treated with ultimate dignity and respect; and

WHEREAS, celebrating June as LGBTQ Pride Month brings awareness and provides support and advocacy for Chatham Borough's LGBTQ community and is an opportunity to act and engage in dialogue to strengthen alliances, build acceptance and advance equal rights; and

WHEREAS, the rainbow flag is widely recognized as a symbol of pride, inclusion and support for social movements that advocate for LGBTQ people in our society and in the Borough of Chatham.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham do hereby proclaim the month of June 2020 as Pride Month in the Borough of Chatham in support of and in solidarity with our LGBTQ community and rainbow flags will be displayed at Borough Hall and along the business district on Main Street during the month of June recognizing LGBTQ residents whose influential and lasting contributions to our neighborhoods make Chatham Borough a vibrant and accepting community in which to live, work and visit.
